

TITLE: Editing and Publishing of the B.R. Wells Rice Research Studies.

SUMMARY:

The B.R. Wells Rice Research Studies serves as an outlet for rice scientists to publish their research while it is in progress and to publish applied research that is important to the successful production of rice in Arkansas, but not publishable in the more rigorous refereed scientific journals. It is read by scientists, farmers, extension agents, consultants and industry. It also serves as an annual report to assess the progress of proposed research.

The B. R. Wells Rice Research Series 2004 was published on time in August 2005 as Arkansas Agriculture Experiment Station Research Series 529. Eleven hundred total copies were published with 600 in paperback and 500 on CD-ROM. The publication can also be found on the Agriculture Communication Services website www.uark.edu/depts/agripub/publications. The publication was 441 pages in length and contained 57 reports. The total cost of the publication was \$8,219.82. The text editing cost \$3,120.77; the 600 paperback copies cost \$4,099.05; and the 500 CD-ROMs cost \$1,000.
